# Four Fields Framework

**Assignment:** Read Mark 4:26-29 by yourself or out loud with a group. Read it aloud three times, using different versions if available.

Have everyone in the group take turns retelling the parable in their own words.

**Discuss:**

What is the main point of the parable for the disciples?

What is needed to expand the kingdom of God?

**Field #1** - The Empty Field - The farmer enters an empty field.

Key Question: How do I identify and enter a new field?

**Field #2** - The Seeded Field - The farmer scatters seed on the ground.

Key Question: What do I say to share the gospel?

**Field #3** - The Field of New Life - The farmer is there to observe and tend to the growing crop.

Key Question: How do I make disciples?

**Field #4** - The Harvested Field - Eventually a season of harvest comes and the farmer is there to cut and bundle the harvest.

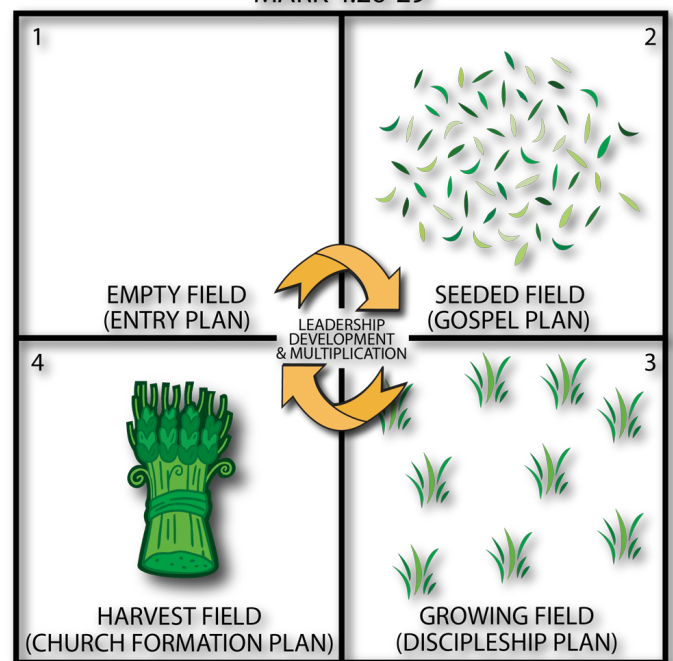
Key Question: How do I form a new believers into groups or churches?

**Leader Multiplication** - Generational Multiplication Potential - Out of the harvest comes both fruit for this year and seed for the coming growing season.

# Four Fields Principles

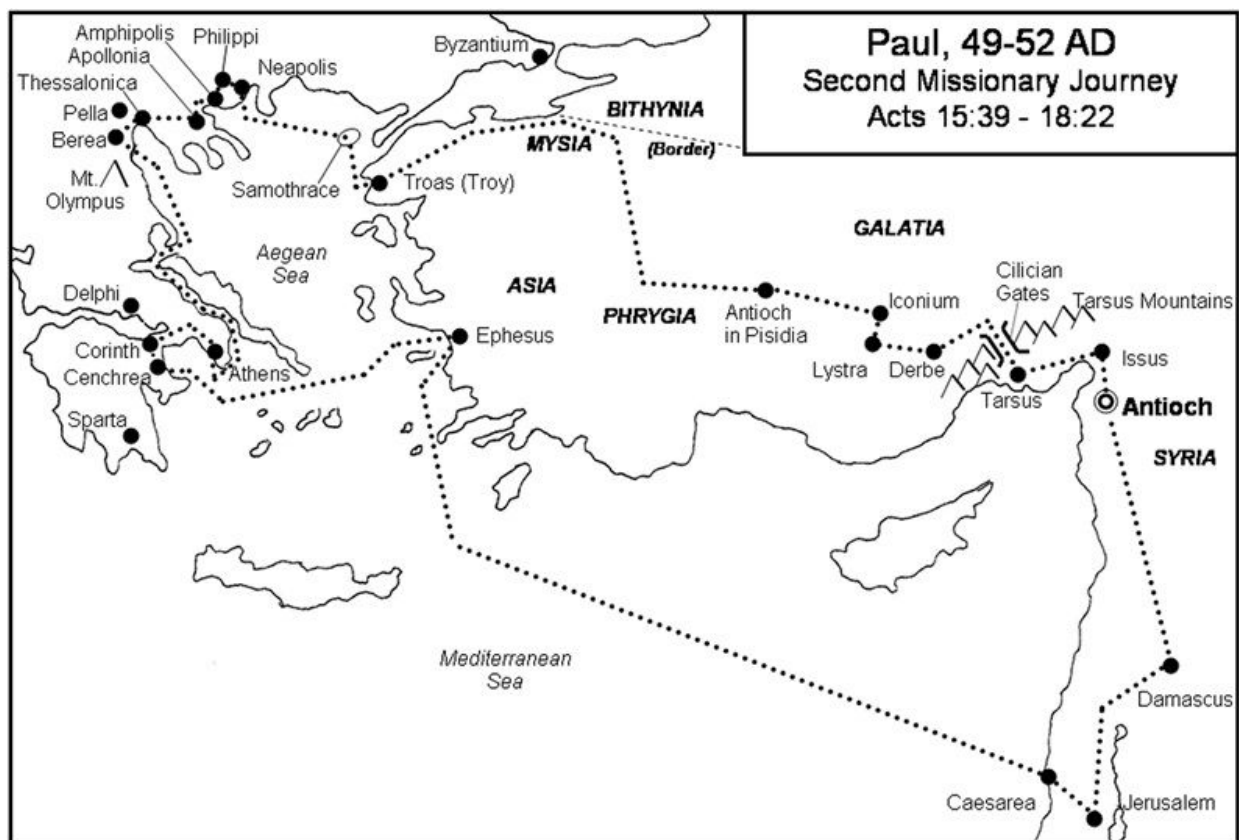
## In the Establishment of the Church in Thessalonica

### Background

The book of Acts is the story of the expansion of the church for the first 30-40 years after the death, resurrection and ascension of Christ. One of the main leaders of this missionary work is the Apostle Paul. Paul took a number of journeys which carried him across much of what is today, Turkey, Greece and Italy. On his second missionary journey (see map), Paul spent three weeks in Thessalonica before he was chased out of town (Acts 17:1-10). A few months later he sent Timothy, one of his assistants back to visit the believers in Thessalonica and then wrote the church their two letters (1 Thessalonians and 2 Thessalonians).

### Assignment

What can we discover about entry strategies, gospel strategies, discipleship strategies, church planting strategies and leadership development strategies from the establishment of the Thessalonian church?
